Specific activities of the University Curriculum Committee were reported regularly to the members of the Faculty Council through the distribution of the minutes of each of the Committee meetings. In addition to the regular curricular items regarding courses and program proposals, the following actions were taken by the Committee:

1. Conducted a study and recommended to the Faculty Council that students enrolled in second bachelor degree programs should not be permitted to declare a second major.
2. Conducted a study of all courses not offered for the past three to five years and requested that departments review these courses and recommend retaining or dropping them.
3. Recommended to the Code Committee procedures for the establishment of new departments and intercollege transfer of existing departments.
4. Conducted a review of the all-University physical education requirement.
5. Conducted a review of the all-University mathematics requirement.
6. Conducted a review of the all-University composition requirement.
7. Established a subcommittee to study maximum credit requirements for completion of a degree program.
8. Established a subcommittee to study area requirements and free electives within degree programs.
