Activities of the University Curriculum Committee were reported regularly to the members of the Faculty Council through the distribution of the minutes of each Committee meeting. In addition to the regular curricular items regarding courses and program proposals, the following activities were carried out by the Committee:

- Completed a review of courses not offered for the past three years.
- 2. Received a report from a subcommittee of the University Curriculum Committee regarding maximum credit requirements for an undergraduate degree. A proposal to drop the 128 credits as a maximum has been prepared for Faculty Council deliberation.
- Established a subcommittee to study the all-University requirements and conduct a survey of the faculty for input to possible changes or additions to the current policy.
- Adopted operating procedures for honors option courses.
- Adopted procedures for curricular review of topics to be offered in general honor colloquia.
- 6. Established a subcommittee to study the use of and controls for awarding credits in Independent Study Courses.
- 7. Reviewed guidelines for joint-listed courses and recommended no changes.
- 8. Revised the guidelines for offering experimental courses.
