Activities of the University Curriculum Committee were reported regularly to the members of the Faculty Council through the distribution of the minutes of each Committee meeting. In addition to the regular curriculum items regarding courses and program proposals, the following activities were carried out by the Committee:

- 1. Received a report from a subcommittee regarding the use of and controls for awarding credits in independent study courses. Adopted a set of guidelines and distributed them to the colleges and departments.
- 2. Reviewed definitions for laboratory courses.
- 3. Established a subcommittee to study computer literacy.
- 4. Established a subcommittee to review guidelines for travel courses. Received and adopted proposed revision to the guidelines.
- Prepared responses to the recommendations contained in the Program Review and Redirection Phases Two and Three, as requested by the Steering Committee.
- Approved a request by a subcommittee on the all-University general education requirements to conduct a survey of Faculty Council members for possible changes or additions to the current policy.
- Recommended that a student representative be made a voting member of the University Curriculum Committee and submitted the proposal to the . Steering Committee for reference.
- 8. Established a subcommittee to review guidelines for group study courses, practicums, and internships.
- 9. Established a subcommittee to study accreditation and certification requirements to determine their effect on programs of study.
