The University Curriculum Committee met weekly and reported its actions periodically through the minutes approved by the Faculty Council. In addition to the usual curricular items in the form of course and program proposals, which included 99 new courses, 82 major course changes, 45 course drops, major changes in 33 curricula, 2 new concentrations, 1 new minor, drops of 1 concentration and 1 minor, and 9 name changes to majors/concentrations/interdisciplinary studies program, the Committee:

- A. Transmitted to the Faculty Council as special action items:
 1. Proposed name change for Department of Recreation Resources.
 2. Proposed name change for Department of Agronomy.
 3. Proposed name change for School of Occupational and Educational Studies.
 4. Proposed name change for Department of Agricultural and Chemical Engineering.
 5. Endorsement of general goals for baccalaureate degrees proposed by the Commission on the Undergraduate Experience.
- B. Approved revision to graduation requirements for B.S. degree in business administration.
- C. Approved revision to upper-division course requirement regarding 500-level courses.
- D. Approved and distributed deadlines for curricular changes.
- E. Reviewed approval process and recommended procedure for curriculum recommendations from the Commission on the Undergraduate Experience.
- F. Elected representatives to the National Universities Degree Consortium, the Articulation and Transfer Agreements Committee, the Task Force for Undergraduate and Graduate International Studies Degrees, and the Search Committee for the Director of Instructional Services.
- G. Proposed a code change regarding the review of graduate programs.
- H. Reviewed all courses proposed for inclusion in the University Studies Program.
