Request	Notes
Prohibit use of titles/topics on courses that have not been approved	In the scheduling process, departments have added topical titles to courses. This is not limited to group or independent studies. These unapproved titles/designations have been transcribed. These titles/labels have been used to designate sections, locations, etc. There has not been any review or approval through a curricular process to assure avoiding title overlap/repetition; appropriateness (connotation to the outside); use to distinguish sections, etc. There are options to this practice as 1) providing information on the 'course description screen' in the scheduling process (to direct students to the appropriate section, only the approved course title will be on the transcript-- not the added information) or 2) proposing experimental courses or subtopics to obtain an approved course title (will be transcribed).

	Therefore, effective Summer 2018 <u>Spring 2019</u> , titles/topics will no longer be added to course titles in the scheduling process unless the course has been approved through the University curricular process.
