<a href="#">AUCC Guidelines: Revisions to Comply with State-Mandated GT Pathways Criteria</a>	<p>The Colorado Department of Higher Education (CDHE) announced a new review/approval process for Guaranteed Transfer (GT) Pathways courses in October 2016, which all institutions are required to comply with. The All-University Core Curriculum (AUCC) guidelines are being revised to conform with the GT Pathways Content Criteria and Student Learning Outcomes.</p> <p>Attached to this proposal are charts displaying the state mandated GT Pathways requirements for each AUCC category. All CSU-specific additions to the CDHE's language have been highlighted on the attached charts. These charts are being submitted for UCC and Faculty Council review to approve the state-mandated language. Edits to the prefatory language in the AUCC Guidelines and Criteria document will be submitted for UCC and Faculty Council review in Fall 2018.</p>
<a href="#">Prohibit Use of Titles/Topics on Courses Numbered That Have Not Been Approved</a>	<p>In the scheduling process, departments have added topical titles to courses. This is not limited to group or independent studies. These unapproved titles/designations have been transcribed. These titles/labels have been used to designate sections, locations, etc. There has not been any review or approval through a curricular process to assure avoiding title overlap/repetition; appropriateness (connotation to the outside); use to distinguish sections, etc. There are options to this practice as 1) providing information on the 'course description screen' in the scheduling process (to direct students to the appropriate section, only the approved course title will be on the transcript-- not the added information) or 2) proposing experimental courses or subtopics to obtain an approved course title (will be transcribed).</p> <p>Therefore, effective Summer 2018, titles/topics will no longer be added to course titles in the scheduling process unless the course has been approved through the University curricular process.
