<p>Removing Language Regarding Grades of 'F' in the AUCC English Composition and Mathematics Requirements</p> <p><i>A separate Special Action memo will be submitted to Faculty Council for review.</i></p>	<p>In 2003, UCC and Faculty Council (see the attached minutes) approved adding the following language to the AUCC English Composition and Mathematics Requirements:</p> <p><u>English Composition:</u> "If a student drops or withdraws from the composition course or does not earn a passing grade, the grade of record will become an “F.” This grade of “F” will be included in the calculation of both the semester GPA and the cumulative GPA as a consequence of not completing the 60-credit completion requirement."</p> <p><u>Mathematics:</u> "If a student drops or withdraws from the course or does not earn a passing grade, the grade of record will become an “F.” This grade of “F” will be included in the calculation of both the semester GPA and the cumulative GPA as a consequence for not completing the 60-credit completion requirement as defined by this policy."</p> <p>The purpose of this request is to remove this language from the AUCC English Composition and Mathematics requirements.</p>
