<a href="#">Major in Business Administration, Accounting Concentration With International Business Concentration</a>	<p>The International Business Concentration could only be completed in combination with one of the existing BUSA-BS concentrations.</p> <p>The 'Experiential Learning Requirement' cannot be encoded in the degree audit (DARS/u.achieve) as written because it is not tied to specific courses. The requirement would need to be manually cleared for each student.</p> <p>Per CIM comments from Assoc. Registrar Katie Rischeill, only the <a href="#">Organizational and Innovation Management Concentration With International Business Concentration</a> would work with the current <a href="#">Statewide Transfer Articulation Agreement</a> (STAA). VPUA would need to request that CDHE add a qualifier to the STAA to not include these concentrations.</p> <p>Should the International Business Concentrations be held to the requirement that 50% of the total credits for the business core and concentration must be completed at CSU as the current concentrations are? This requirement only seems to be in the catalog on the <a href="#">overview page for the Major in Business Administration</a> (5<sup>th</sup> ¶), but it is enforced through the degree audit. Should it be added to the POS and MCM tabs for each concentration?</p>	Fall 2019
