We would like to separate these courses by subject code to prevent confusion. 2) We have at least 16 potential courses that will fit into the STAR acronym with the potential to create more. 3) The A, B, C, numbering approach with the same course number is not feasible, because these courses are distinct topics that should have their own unique names. 4) Some of the course offerings will have subtopics which will require the use of the A, B, C, numbering approach with the same course number using the new subject code STAR.
