'As needed' offering term	<p>See CIM course form help bubbles text below:</p> <p>Offering Year: Course must be offered in year's designation--every, odd, or even. If Departments want to offer in an additional year they may do so. 'As needed' will be allowed only in those cases where there is not a program dependency (a course is required in one or more programs) or for flexible graduate programs.</p> <p>Offering Term: Course must be offered in year and term selected to provide planning information to students, advisors, programs, and department. If Departments also want to offer the course in a term not identified they may do so. For example, if the course is approved for a Fall offering but the department also wants to offer it in Spring they may do so.</p> <p>As Needed should be limited to Graduate-level courses not specifically required in an approved program.</p>
