ANNOUNCEMENTS

Permanent Study Abroad course proposals – Once a Study Abroad course has been offered successfully at least <u>one</u> time, it can be proposed as a permanent course. Permanent Study Abroad course proposals must be submitted on a separate <u>new course proposal – they cannot be submitted as edits to the 'provisional' -82 course in CIM</u>. Proposers can utilize the 'Copy Current Course Data' button in the top right of the new course form to copy most of the course data over from the provisional course. The 'Supporting Documents' attachments may need to be reattached to the new proposal. The CIM course form does not currently allow departments to enter a course number when they select 'Study Abroad' (screenshot below). The Course Number field is grayed out, so departments can only select the Course Level instead. We have this issue on our list for the annual CIM form updates next summer. In the meantime, departments should let us know what course number ending in -00 to -79 they would like to use by either emailing <u>curriculum@colostate.edu</u> or listing it on the CIM course proposal in the 'Justification for Request' field or by adding a Comment. The Curriculum & Catalog Unit would then update the course number in CIM.
